Rev. Goanar J. Chol was married to Batul K. Chol in 1989. They have three children: Esther (Nyajal) Chol, in Pre-Med at the University of Iowa; Lam Chol, Drake University; and Lieb Chol, a freshman at Iowa State University.

I was born on May 29, 1951 in Waat County, Akobo district under the former Upper Nile Province, South Sudan. I was educated partly in Sudan and went to Grace Bible College in Jimma, Kaffa Province, Ethiopia. I graduated in 1977, after which I went back to Sudan and became a teacher at Giffen Bible School in Doleib Hill, South Sudan (1977-78). This is where pastors are trained for ministry before ordination.

I worked as an International Evangelist for Ambassadors for Christ International and traveled worldwide in the Middle East and Singapore in southwest Asia from 1979 to 1983. I also worked as an Area Community Development Officer with the Sudan Council of Churches (SCC) from 1983 to 1991. While working with the SCC, I received training at Coady International Institute, St. Francis Xavier University, Nova Scotia, Canada in 1986 and graduated with a degree in Social Development.

In January 1991, the Chol family was displaced and then separated for three years, til July 1994 by the war that had erupted in 1983. While in exile, my church called me and I was ordained December 15, 1991 as Minister of Word and Sacrament (without a salary, but serving God) by the Presbyterian Church of the Sudan. I had been in exile in Akobo areas controlled by the Sudan Liberation Army/Sudan Liberation movement (SPLA/SPLM) fighting the Islamic government.

Due to the war, I went to study again in St. Paul's University, Lumuru Kenya, East Africa for my Masters of Divinity. I graduated in 1995.

In March 1996, the Chols came to the United States and lived in Bloomington, Indiana until August 15, 1999. At that time, the Presbyteries of Des Moines and Missouri River Valley called the Chol family to come and minister to the Sudanese in the two states. We have been living in the Des Moines area ever since. I also worked for the Synod of Lakes and Prairies from 2000-2004, returning once again to the two presbyteries. At the present time, I am the Sudanese Ministries Resource Person in the Des Moines Presbytery.

As of June 2013, I am now in the Doctor of Ministry program at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary. With this comes lots of new challenges. God Bless!
